

# WOUNDS MALAYSIA: KUALA LUMPUR INTERNATIONAL WOUND CONFERENCE 2017

## GUIDELINE FOR POSTER PRESENTATION

1. All poster presenters **MUST** register for the conference and pay the required fees **BEFORE** the conference. Follow the instructions and payment procedures at the North Borneo Wound Conference website: [www.woundconference.com.my](http://www.woundconference.com.my)
2. All posters shall be mounted on exhibition boards in a designated area in the conference hotel. Please check the conference website for the exact poster exhibiton area/room.
3. Your poster will be displayed throughout the three days of the conference. You will be assigned a number as to where your poster will be displayed. Please email an abstract of your presentation to: **enquiry@mswcp.org** by 31st August 2017.
4. **UPDATE!** Display panels for your posters will be placed in the Royal Chulan VIP area. Please make sure you set up your poster before 7.30am on the 29<sup>th</sup> of September 2017 and have it removed by 12.30pm on the 1<sup>st</sup> of October 2017.
5. Posters prepared for presentation must be of a standard size of A1 (594mm x 841mm). Each poster must include the following information: Title of paper, name of author(s), affiliation, introduction, methodology, results and discussion and conclusions.
6. **UPDATE!** You are required to bring your own mounting tape (double-sided tape) and/or thumb tack for your poster. Solid panel boards require double-sided tape and thumb tack boards require thumb tack. It is always better to avoid preparing posters that are too heavy for mounting.
7. **UPDATE!** Your double-sided mounting tape should be of the acrylic type. Upon peeling the outer layer, the tape will have a translucent adhesive material. We encourage the usage of this type to prevent damage to the paint on the solid panel.
